I understand that the Ministry in Context (MIC) program requires the following commitments from me:

1. Establish a Lay Committee of 3-4 people before the student begins;
2. Meet with the student for reflection sessions at least once per month to focus on:
 - a) the student's personal, theological, and diaconal or pastoral growth;
 - b) feedback involving student participation in ministry--highlighting the areas of growth and success as well as areas for continued learning and development;
 - c) integration of academic and experiential learning;
3. Provide the student with leadership experiences in ministry, including regular worship leadership in a variety of roles;
4. Complete end-of-semester student reflection conversations and forms in a timely manner.
